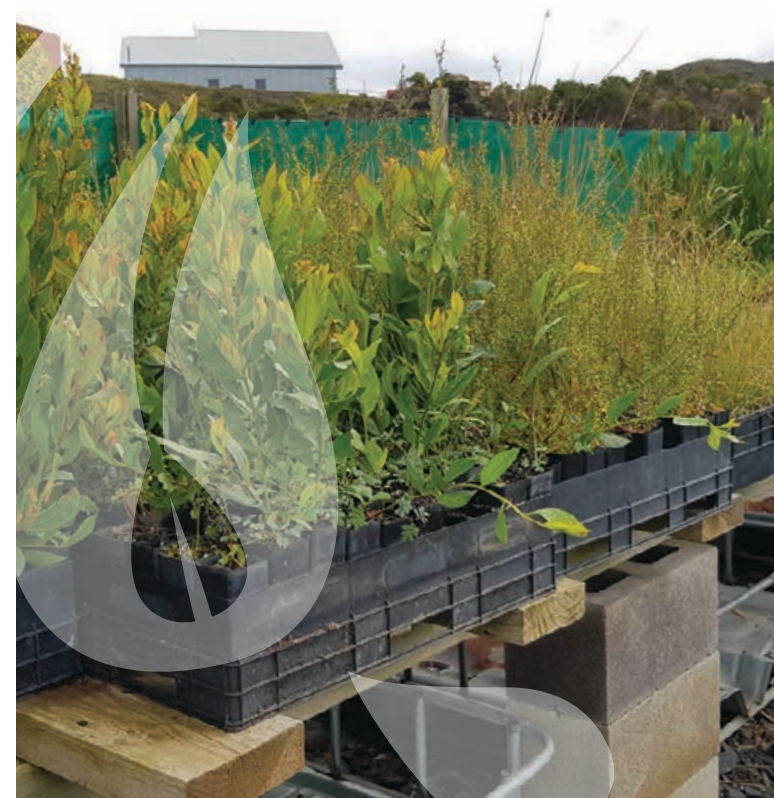
The plant propagation cycle means that Tubestock and Hico plants are generally available for pickup from April each year, but this is plant dependent.

To meet April timing, orders are generally required by October the previous year.

Seeds and/or cuttings are propagated and grown to tubestock plants and then sold for revegetation to:

- ✔ Government organisations & Shire Councils
- ✔ Landcare Groups
- ✔ Individual landholders
- ✔ Plant nurseries / Landscapers



## Our fabulous Teams

Seed Collection Team\* are our intrepid explorers, seeking out nooks, swamplands, sandy rises and bush tracks to find indigenous seeds and cuttings from the local area. Monday 9am – 11am (locations differ each week)

The Nursery Team† are our 'eager beavers' who clean, sort and propagate the harvested seeds and cuttings, meeting at our shed and nursery at the State Coal Mine. Wednesday 10am – 12 noon.

\* We are licensed to collect seed by Bass Coast Shire Council and Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP).

† The Nursery Team hibernates over some winter months.

## We are all Volunteers at the WSBN
